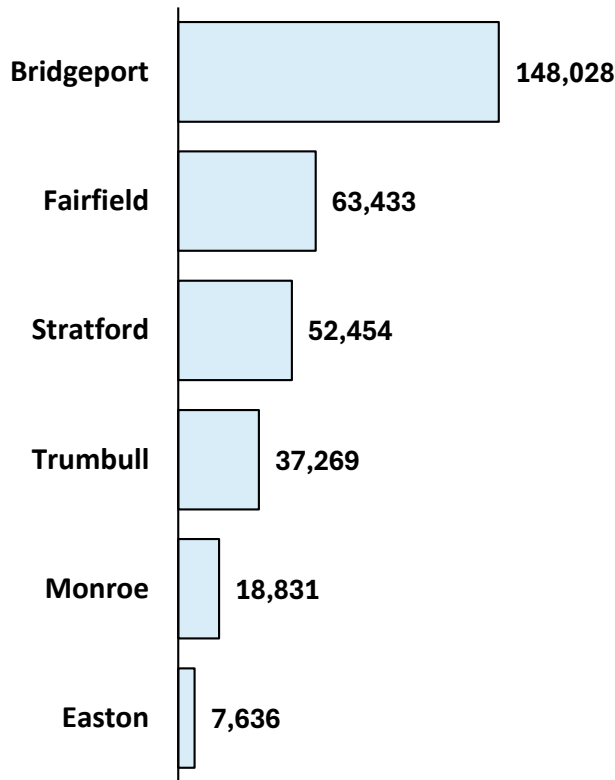




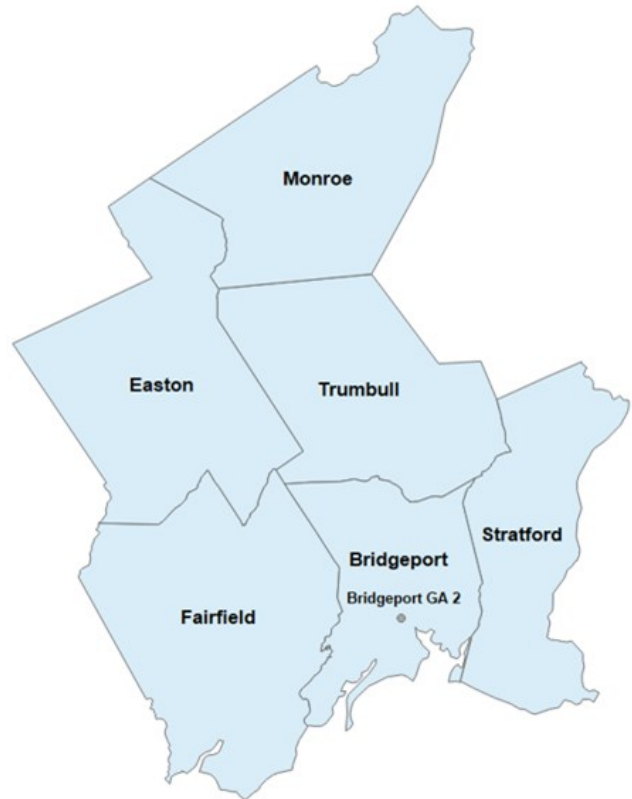

Demographics

Population



Towns in the Bridgeport JD



The Bridgeport Judicial District (JD) serves six towns in the southwestern part of the state. The JD’s only Geographical Area (GA) court, GA 2, is one of the busiest GA courts in the state. About 325,000 people live within the six-town area, making the Bridgeport JD the fourth most populous in the state. About 45% of residents in the JD live in the city of Bridgeport. In addition to being the largest and most ethnically diverse town in the JD, about 42% of Bridgeport residents are Hispanic. Black non-Hispanics make up approximately 33% of the city’s population. The median family income varies considerably across the towns in Bridgeport JD. In 2024, the median family income in Bridgeport was estimated at \$54,440. In Easton, the median family income was \$181,934. Stratford, with a per family income of \$91,025, is the only other town in the JD besides Bridgeport with a median household income lower than the statewide average of \$108,890 per the American Community Survey (2023).

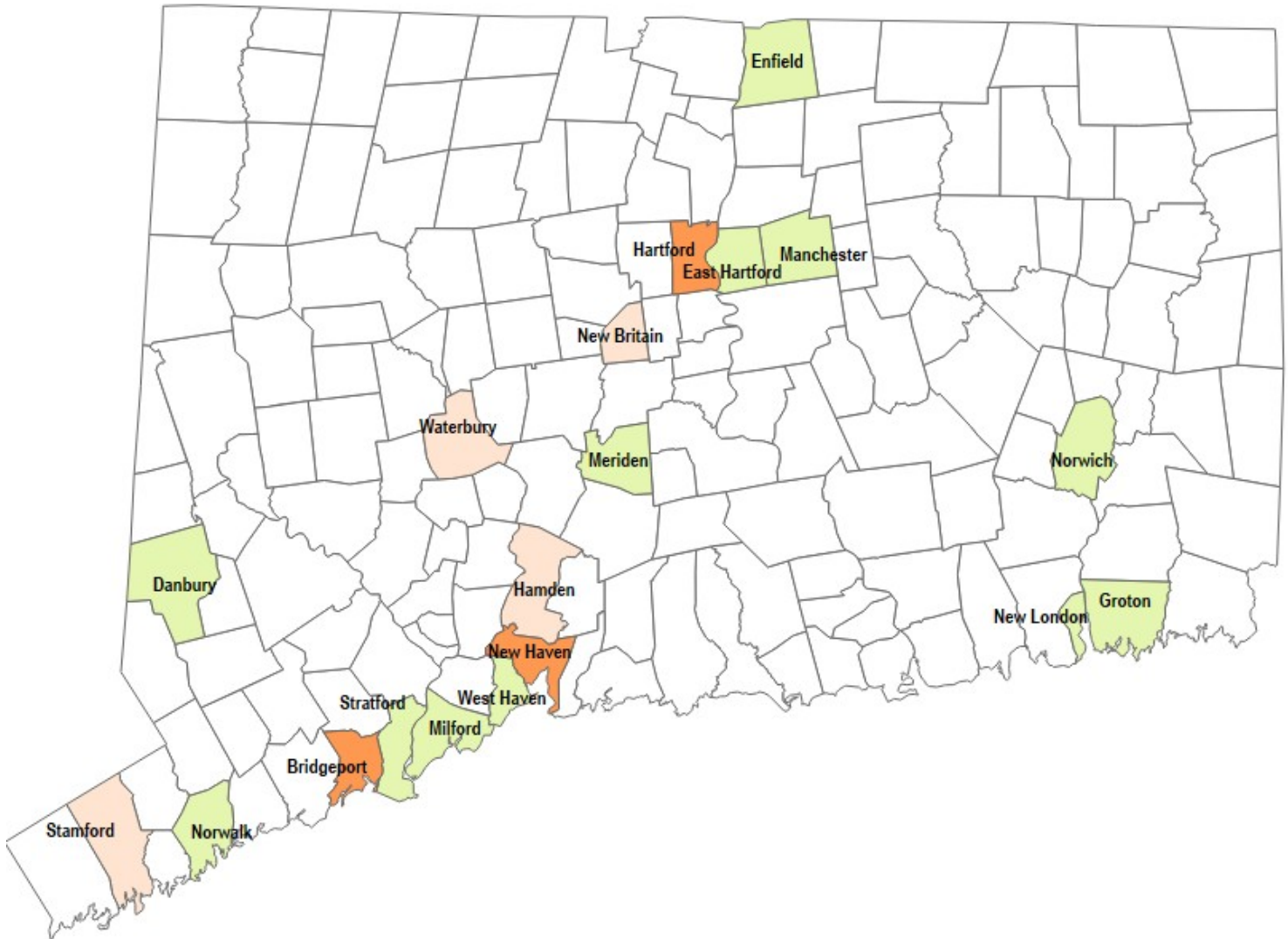

Demographics

The map below groups Connecticut's cities and towns into four groups based on reported violent crime. The three cities (Hartford, New Haven and Bridgeport) account for 40% of total violent crime, the remaining groups each represent roughly 20% of reported violent crime.

Crime

Each year, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) releases its Uniform Crime Report (UCR) which details the number of major crimes that were reported by state and local jurisdictions in the previous calendar year. In the FBI data, violent crimes include murders, non-negligent manslaughters, robberies, aggravated assaults and sexual assaults. Property crimes include larcenies, burglaries and motor vehicle thefts.

As is the case in most years, the vast majority of violent crimes reported in the JD occurred in Bridgeport. In 2024 that figure reached 86% of all reported violent crimes. Interestingly, while Bridgeport led the JD in violent crime rates, the city was third, behind Trumbull and Stratford, in property crime rate and its property crime rate is nearly equivalent to Fairfield.

Compared to other JDs, Bridgeport ranked third in the state for the number of reported violent crimes in 2024. As was previously noted, much of this crime was reported in the city of Bridgeport. The violent crime rate in the Bridgeport JD was the second highest in the state, only behind the New Haven JD.

Arrests

The Bridgeport Police Department (Bridgeport PD) is the most active law enforcement agency in the JD. Each year, the Bridgeport PD sees the most reported crime and makes the most arrests in the JD. In 2024, the Bridgeport PD made 52% of the JD's arrests and investigated 48% of reported crimes.

Warrant Review

In addition to handling cases, prosecutors review warrant applications for police agencies in the JDs. Bridgeport PD, once again, is the leader in warrant applications submitted to prosecutors in the JD. Unlike other districts, Bridgeport JD also reviews a number of state search warrants submitted by federal agencies.

Case Movement

The majority of cases disposed in Connecticut courts each year are handled in 17 Geographic Area (GA) courts. GA courts typically handle less serious felonies as well as all misdemeanor cases and other low level offenses. The Bridgeport GA court typically handled between 6,500 and 7,000 criminal cases each calendar year prior to the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2024, 29% of GA 2 cases involved felony offenses. More serious felony cases were generally transferred to the Part A court at the JD.

Criminal and motor vehicle matters are not the only cases handled in the criminal court system. Infractions (which are usually disposed of with payment of a fine) transfer to GA courts if they are not resolved by prosecutors working at the Judicial Branch's Centralized Infraction Bureau. Regional infraction hubs handle the largest share of these cases.

In recent years, the Part A court in the Bridgeport JD typically disposed between 275 and 400 cases. Pending cases have fallen by double digit rates two of the last three years. The number of trials to verdict has increased steadily since the COVID-19 pandemic years.

Case Movement

Criminal Possession of a Firearm

Cases analyzed on this page all include (at least) a charge of 53a-217 or 53a-217c. Other charges may be present on the file. Conviction rates are based on a case level disposition whereby, should one charge levied against the defendant result in a conviction, the case is deemed to be a conviction. The charge of criminal possession of a firearm may or may not be the charge resulting in the conviction on a particular case.

Pending Cases Trends

Overall, pending case counts have declined over the past five years. The tables below show the January 1st figures for criminal and motor vehicle cases pending in each court around the state. These figures, typically, do not include infractions. The number of pending cases in Part B courts increased for the first time in five years in 2025.

Currently GA 2 in Bridgeport sits fourth among all Part B courts, in terms of pending cases, having been overtaken in recent years by GA 15 (New Britain) and GA 1 (Stamford). Stamford data includes the operations of GA 20 (Norwalk) which closed during the period of time analyzed in this report.

GA 14 in Hartford includes consolidated operations with GA 13 (Enfield) and the Hartford Community Court.

Case Movement

Pending Cases Trends

As the number of pending cases have declined in the Bridgeport Part A court, the mixture of offenses on the docket has changed. The tables below depict the changing landscape of the top ten cases over the past three years. As the number of pending cases in Part A has declined, one effect has been to concentrate the most serious offenses in the Part A.

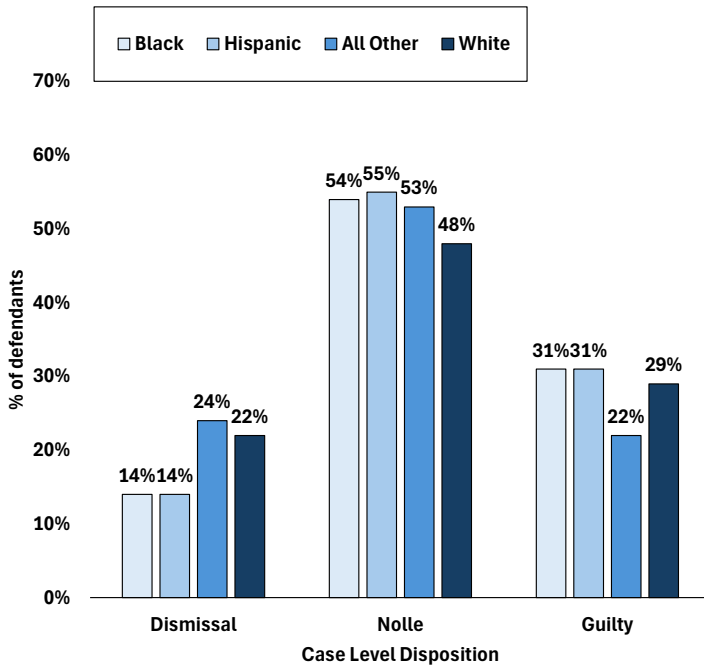

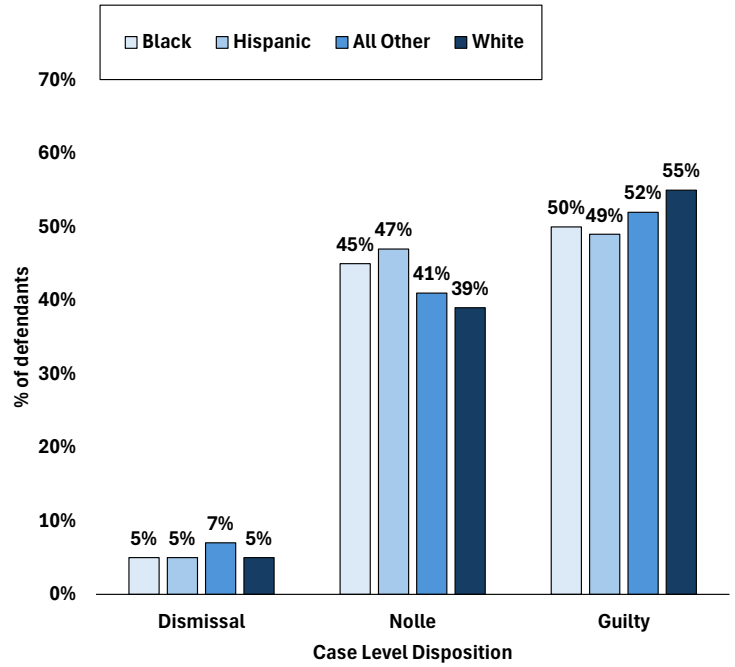

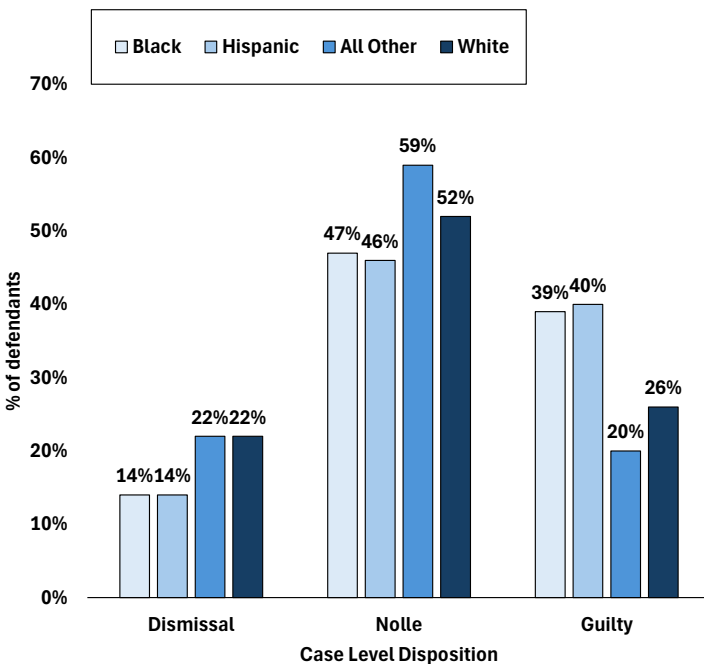
All Judicial Districts - All Defendants (2023)



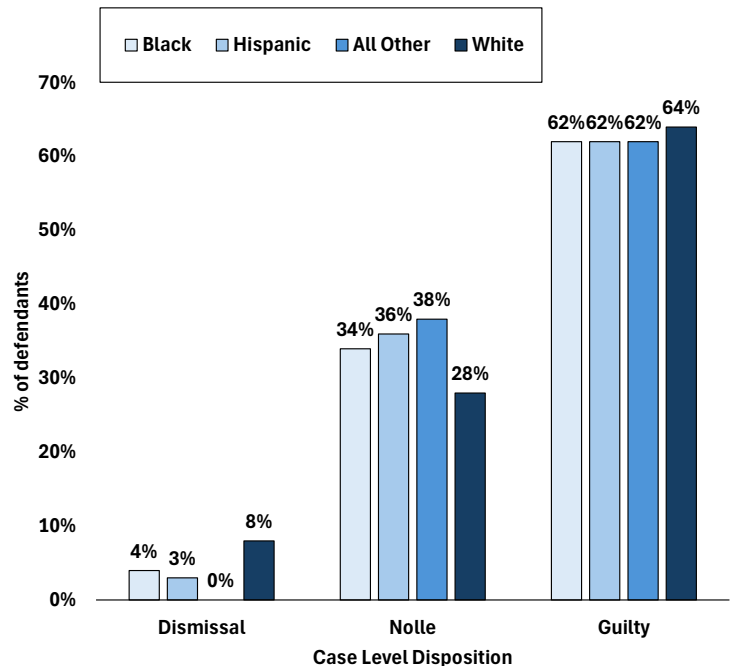
All Judicial Districts - Felony Criminal History (2023)

Trials

The figures shown below represent cases that reached a verdict across the state, as either a jury or court trial. For purposes of this data analysis, it is important to note that some cases are submitted to the jury but do not result in a unanimous verdict. Such cases, despite the workload involved, do not get counted in the trial data submitted by the Judicial Branch to the Division. Some cases move through the trial process only to resolve by plea agreement prior to jury deliberations. When cases resolve via plea agreement in this way they are not counted as a trial even though the prosecutor has picked a jury and presented evidence.

Court operations, particularly trials, were limited in 2021 and 2022 by the social distancing guidelines enacted in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. These precautions delayed trial preparations and therefore trial hearings well beyond the court closures which initially were lifted in the summer of 2020, but were reinstated periodically over the next year.
