

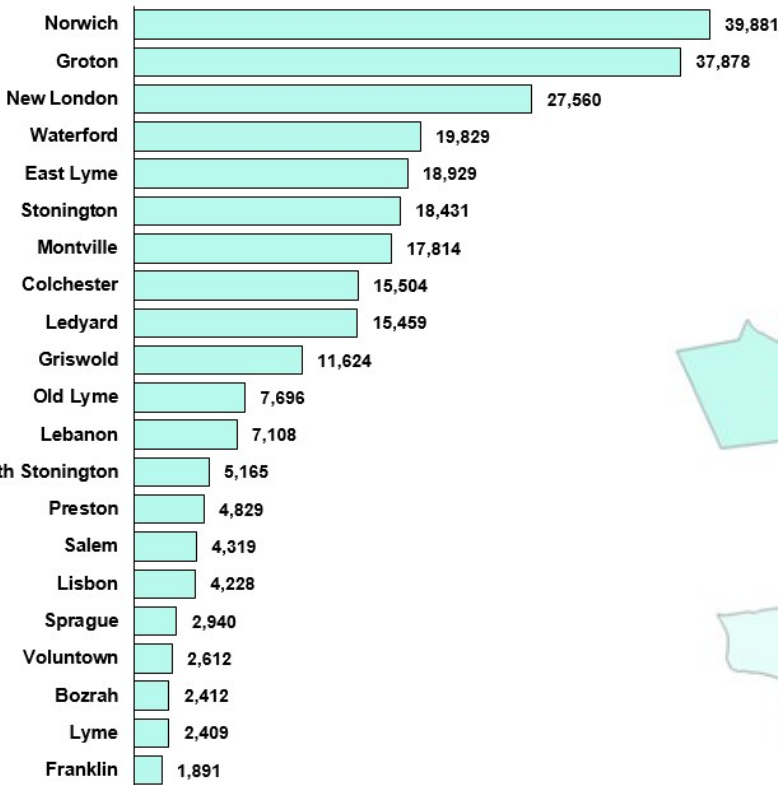

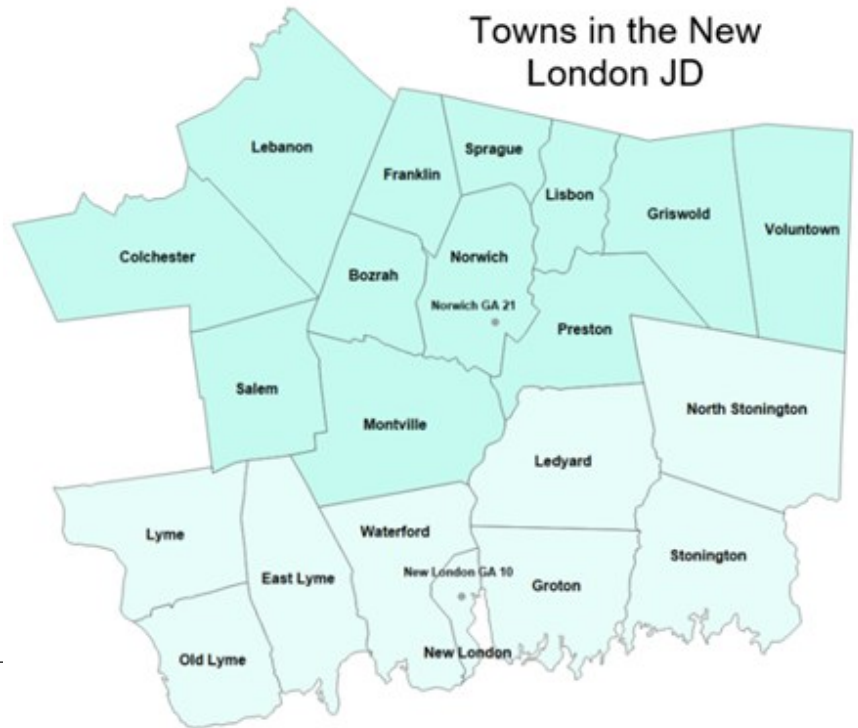

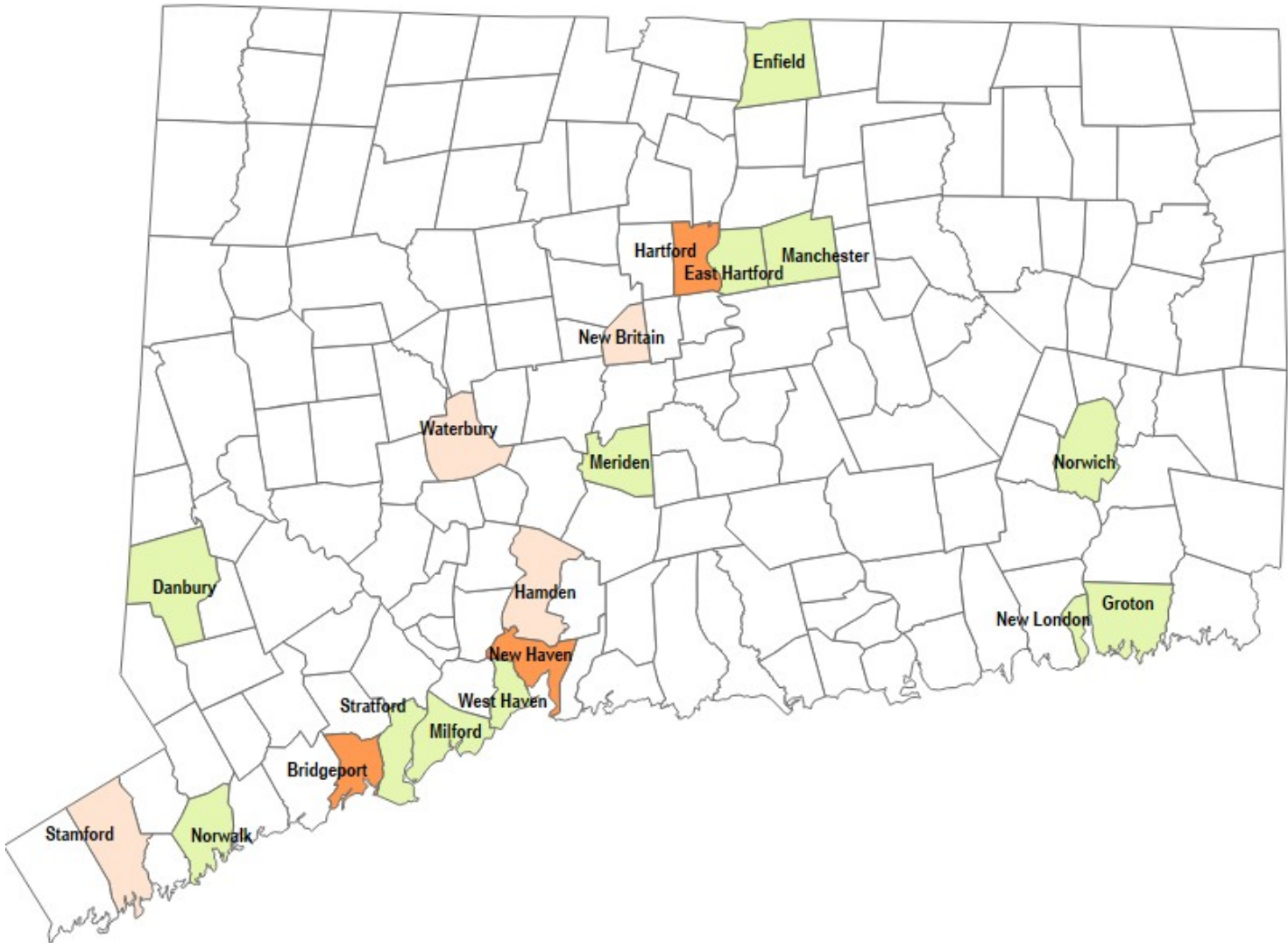
The New London Judicial District (JD) contains 21 small- and medium-sized towns, two Native American reservations, 2 prisons and U.S. Navy and Coast Guard facilities. The district has two GA courts: GA 10 in New London and GA 21 in Norwich. The JD also includes a juvenile court in Waterford. Approximately 27% of District residents belong to minority communities. Almost half of minority residents live in Norwich and New London. In addition, Groton is home to a U.S. Navy submarine base. About 268,000 residents live in the JD. District-wide, the average median family income in 2023 was estimated at \$95,310. Statewide, per capita income was \$108,890. Within the District per capita income ranged from \$56,237 in New London to \$122,116 in Old Lyme, according to the American Community Survey (2023).

Demographics

The map below groups Connecticut's cities and towns into four groups based on reported violent crime. The three cities (Hartford, New Haven and Bridgeport) account for 40% of total violent crime, the remaining groups each represent roughly 20% of reported violent crime.

Crime

Each year, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) releases its Uniform Crime Report (UCR) which details the number of major crimes that were reported by state and local jurisdictions in the previous calendar year. In the FBI data, violent crimes include murders, non-negligent manslaughters, robberies, aggravated assaults and sexual assaults. Property crimes include larcenies, burglaries and motor vehicle thefts.

The cities of Norwich and New London lead the New London Judicial District in terms of reported violent crime. These two cities account for 57% of the JD's reported violent crime in 2024. In terms of property crime, Norwich, New London, and Groton account for 52% of all reported property crime in the New London JD in 2024.

The New London JD ranked seventh in the state for the number of reported violent crimes and ninth for the number of reported property crimes in 2024. Both the violent crime rate and property crime rate are below the state average.

Arrests

The Norwich Police Department (Norwich PD) is the most active law enforcement agency in the JD, although unlike in other JDs, the court is not dominated by a single police department. New London PD among several others contribute significantly to the cases handled by the New London JD.

Warrant Review

In addition to handling cases, prosecutors review warrant applications for police agencies in the Judicial District. The New London JD is again atypical. The agency submitting the most warrants for review is not a municipal department or state police barracks, but Adult Probation.

Case Movement

The majority of cases disposed in Connecticut courts each year are handled in 17 Geographic Area (GA) courts. GA courts typically handle less serious felonies as well as all misdemeanor cases and other low level offenses. In 2024, The New London GA court handled about 8,300 criminal and motor vehicle cases and 5,600 infractions. More serious felony cases were generally transferred to the Part A court at the JD.

Criminal and motor vehicle matters are not the only cases handled in the criminal court system. Infractions (which are usually disposed of with payment of a fine) transfer to GA courts if they are not resolved by prosecutors working at the Judicial Branch's Centralized Infraction Bureau. Regional infraction hubs handle the largest share of these cases.

Part A courts handle more serious offenses. The most frequently added cases to Part A courts (all Judicial Districts and the New London JD specifically) are shown to the left. Cases with multiple charges were categorized by the most serious charge, ranked from A felony to D misdemeanor.

Part B courts typically handle cases that are less serious than those in Part A. Categorized using the same methodology as described above, the tables to the left show that most cases in Part B are misdemeanor files.

Criminal Possession of a Firearm

Cases analyzed on this page all include (at least) a charge of 53a-217 or 53a-217c. Other charges may be present on the file. Conviction rates are based on a case level disposition whereby, should one charge levied against the defendant result in a conviction, the case is deemed to be a conviction. The charge of criminal possession of a firearm may or may not be the charge resulting in the conviction on a particular case.

Pending Cases Trends

Overall, pending case counts have declined over the past five years. The tables below show the January 1st figures for criminal and motor vehicle cases pending in each court around the state. These figures, typically, do not include infractions. The number of pending cases in Part B courts increased for the first time in five years in 2025.

Currently, GA 10 in New London sits eighth and GA 21 in Norwich sits ninth among all Part B courts in terms of pending cases.

Stamford data includes the operations of GA 20 (Norwalk) which closed during the period of time analyzed in this report.

GA 14 in Hartford includes consolidated operations with GA 13 (Enfield) and the Hartford Community Court.

Case Movement

Pending Cases Trends

As the number of pending cases have declined in the New London Part A court, the mixture of offenses on the docket has changed. The tables below depict the changing landscape of the top ten cases over the past three years. As the number of pending cases in Part A has declined, one effect has been to concentrate the most serious offenses in the Part A.

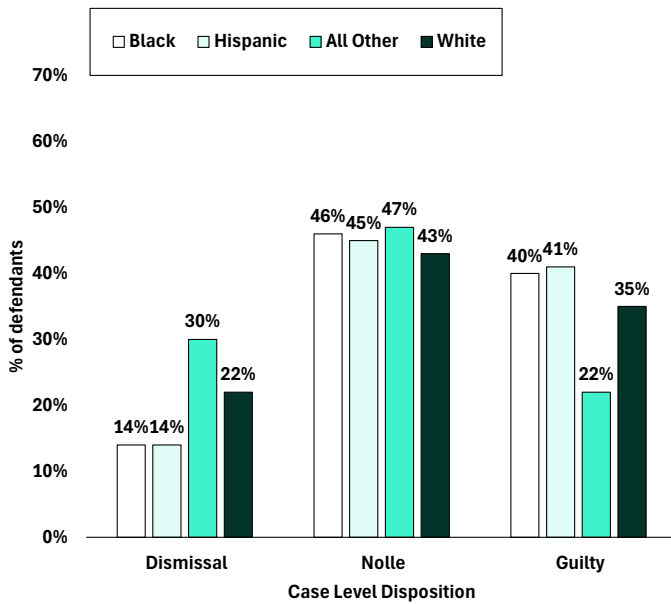

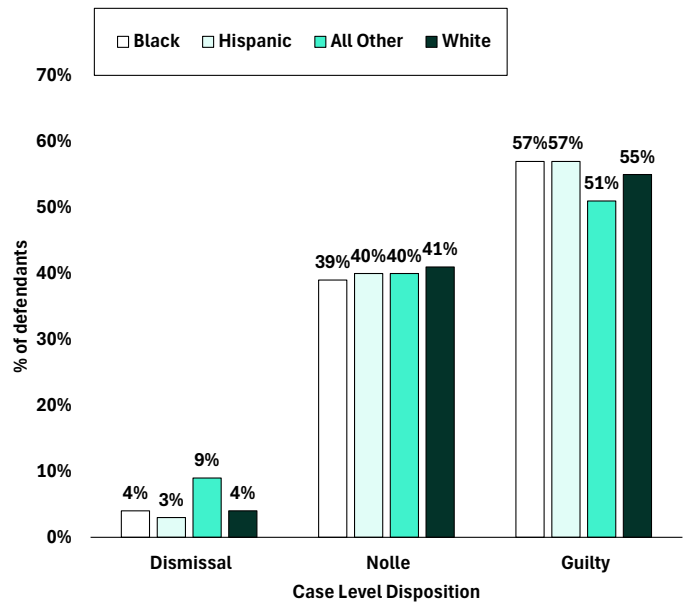

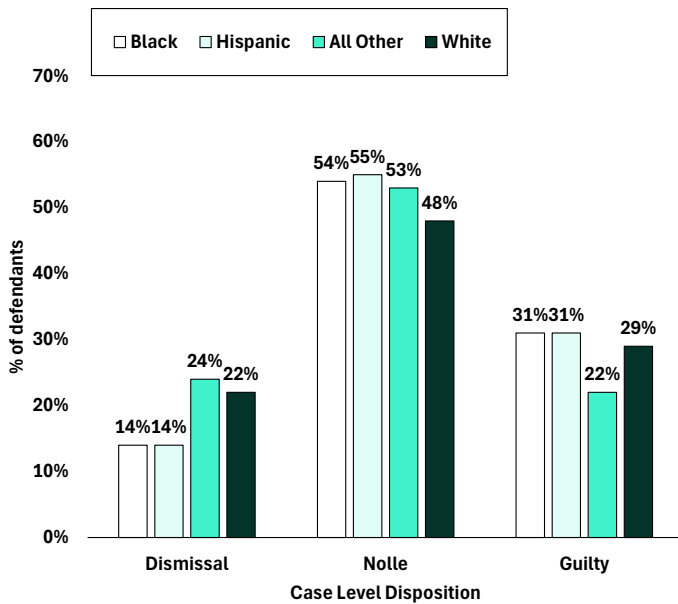
New London Judicial District - All Defendants (2023)



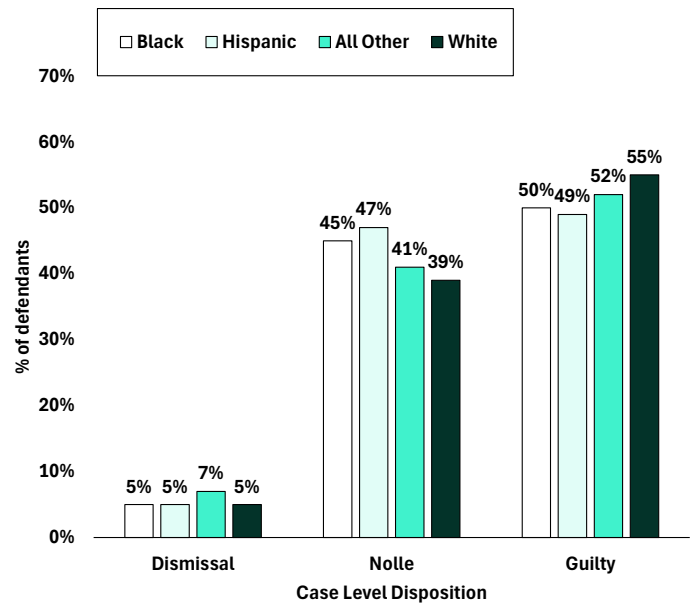
New London Judicial District - Felony Criminal History (2023)

Trials

The figures shown below represent cases that reach a verdict across the state. For purposes of this data analysis, it is important to note that some cases are submitted to the jury but do not result in a unanimous verdict. Such cases, despite the workload involved, do not get counted in the trial data submitted by the Judicial Branch to the Division. In some cases move through the trial process only to resolve by plea agreement prior to jury deliberations. When cases resolve via plea agreement in this way they are not counted as a trial even though the prosecutor has picked a jury and presented evidence.

Court operations, particularly trials, were limited in 2021 and 2022 by the social distancing guidelines enacted in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Statewide, the number of pending violent felony cases has decreased by 14% year over year, which is possibly related to the increase in the number of trials occurring in recent years.
