10/17/36 R.P. Marshall writes. Only two trees of ten left in nursery at Rose Garden of East Rock Park. Mr. Zuger is nurseryman now. One left is a bush 2 1/2 ft high - several sprouts. The other 4 ft. high and trunk almost girdled at base by large canker. Other 8 trees transplanted in golf course but died.

4/3/36. letter from R.P. Mottolo Mr. Zuger reported (because of illness) by Pieter van Weeningen. Both trees living about 8' high + in good condition. One has 2 buds. Trees planted too close together. Nov. 1923 Dr. B. J. Galloway reported 25 trees present and doing well.
